THE STUDENT - THE COURSE

It has repeatedly occurred that a student on Ethics lines, Cramping lines, Practical lines, Interneship lines, comes to "fall off the lines".

The rule is very simple.

THE FINAL RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE STUDENT, HIS LOCATION, HIS ACTIONS, HIS PROGRESS COMES UNDER THE D OF T.

Any rule or regulation which seeks to hinder the D of T or his legal representative, that particular student's Course Supervisor, is null and void.

Ethics actions, Case Review, Practical Work, Interneships (like on FEBC) are all actions which aid the D of T and his supervisors in the accomplishment of his Goal, which is the creation of valuable final products who can duplicate Source in application of his data.

This applies to any supervisor, any D of T of any Scientology Course.

Reversely the D of T must at every moment of the day either know or be able to have data concerning any given student within a few minutes.

And he must know at the end of each day exactly what each student has been doing, where he has been etc, and by "he must know" is meant that each of his supervisors must have that data for the students entrusted to their care, and have to be able to give him that data on demand.

The D of T has all the right in the world to send a messenger or note to Ethics, or to the D of P, or to whoever the student's current senior is in practical, and demand an immediate answer as to the current state of the student.

C/S data do not fall under this category, but a D of P estimate as to how long the student is expected to be on auditing lines is valid data.

The D of T MUST be informed if one of his students is found to be an R/Ser, and he has the right to refuse the student back on the course unless given an attestation by the C/S that the R/S has been handled.

HOWEVER THE RULE MUST BE VERY WELL UNDERSTOOD THAT THE D OF T CARRIES THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR EACH STUDENT ENTRUSTED TO HIS CARE, AND THAT VIOLATION OF THIS WILL BE COMM-ERVED.

The D of T is well advised to insist on his rights and demand Ethics action for anyone seeking to deviate him from his purpose.
